



Upstream prevention focused on high risk/vulnerable young people and risky transitions, such as leaving prison.

e.g. transition pathways from care to sustainable

RECOVERY

PREVENTION

Prevention of repeat homelessness sofa surfing & rough sleeping.





e.g. Housing First

for Youth



Preventing homelessness likely to occur within 56 days, in line with Welsh legislation which asks local authorities to intervene to help households threatened with homelessness.



EMERGENCY PREVENTION

Support for those at immediate risk of homelessness, especially young people sleeping rough.





Youth homelessness in

over 6300 young people aged 16-25 sought support for homelessness in Wales

73% of people who are homeless once will be homeless again

Increase in the average time young people spend in TA: 71% (113 days) for 18-25 y/o and 35% (84 days) for 16-17 y/o

Why is youth homelessness

different?

Family breakdown is the leading cause of youth homelessness

Young people face discrimination in housing

Young people may lack life skills necessary to maintain a stable home

Young people for financial disadvantages in saving, benefits, and wages

Young people are vulnerable to exploitation

Homelessness White Paper



- Threatened with homelessness definition Increase from 6 weeks to 6 months
- Changes to intentionality test
- Changes to the priority need test in theory
- · Identify, refer, and cooperate



- Lack of a true preventative focus
- Changes to priority need test in practice
- Lack of change to the local connection test
- Absence of Schools and other education provides in the duty
