Existing Homes Alliance Scotland manifesto launch

CIH Scotland is a member of the Existing Homes Alliance Scotland (ExHAS) a coalition of organisations calling for urgent action and increased investment to ensure that homes across all tenures are energy efficient and fit for purpose. CIH Scotland responds to consultation on the suspension of local connection referrals

Currently, if a homeless household presents in a local authority area where they do not have a connection, the local authority can refer them back to another area where they do have a connection. The Scottish Government has confirmed that they intend to suspend this power for all local authorities in Scotland.


