### Scottish Housing Day

The fifth annual Scottish Housing Day focussed on the value of social housing and we were pleased to see more organisations than ever take part with over 120 signing up to support the campaign. Homes at the Heart: a manifesto for Scotland's housing sector 2021-2026

In September we launched the CIH Scotland Manifesto calling for housing to be at the heart of our social and economic recovery from Covid-19 and to be prioritised in all party manifestos ahead of the Scottish Parliament elections next year.

#### Parliamentary evidence

The Scottish Parliament's Local Government and Communities Committee put out a call for evidence on the financial impact of Covid-19 on local authorities across Scotland. Our response highlights significant concerns around increasing rent arears, the ability to deliver services, maintain and build new homes and increased pressure on homelessness services. The Programme for Government (PfG), **Protecting Scotland, Renewing Scotland**, was introduced by the First Minister, Nicola Sturgeon on 1 September 2020.
