### Our Influencing work

#### **Cross Party Group on Housing**

CIH Scotland took part in a sub-group of the Cross Party Group on Housing tasked with developing a report on rent control options to inform the Scottish Government's commitment to introducing rent control in the private rented sector during this parliamentary term. The report explores various forms of rent control, setting out potential challenges and consequences for the Scottish market. The report was launched at the Cross Party Group's AGM, attended by Patrick Harvie MSP, Minister for Zero Carbon Buildings, Active Travel and Tenants' Rights. Read the report here.



#### **National Care Service**
