### Focus on Influencing Scotland



#### FEBRUARY 2022

At the beginning of February, we launched Walking the talk - An overview of the right to adequate housing and human rights issues for landlords in Scotland.

We know if someone does not have an adequate home, it is hard for them to exercise their other human rights, including the right to family life, privacy, work and health. Therefore, adequate housing should be central to any human rights discussions.

Our sector has a part to play, housing providers should be championing the need for an ongoing national dialogue on adequate housing, how it could be interpreted from a practical and operational perspective and the practical steps that could be taken to progress it considering available resources.

Amongst all of this it is of particular importance that progressing human rights takes place in a way in which vulnerable or disadvantaged groups are not left behind. We look forward to working with you to make sure the priorities of the housing sector are reflected as the Scottish Government develops and implements new human rights legislation, ensuring that housing is at the forefront.

#### **Domestic Abuse**

We met with tenant rights minister Patrick Harvie MSP to discuss the progress of the monitoring and implementation group in embedding the recommendation of the improving housing outcomes report. The next meeting on the group will take place in February.

#### **National Care Service**

We met with the Cabinet Secretary for Social Justice, Housing and Local Government Shona Robison MSP and minister for social care Kevin Stewart MSP to discuss the Scottish Government plan for a national care service alongside the CEs from Blackwood, Horizon Housing Association and Viewpoint Housing. We discussed the proposed national care services and the need to embed housing in the structures of any new model of care delivery.

#### National Housing and Dementia Forum

The Forum co-chaired by CIH Scotland and the University of Stirling is continuing to gather evidence on the role of housing in supporting people living with dementia. The findings of the Forum will be reported to the Scottish Government later this year with a view to ensuring that housing is firmly embedded within the next iteration of the National Dementia Strategy.
