

CIH Level 5 Diploma In Housing



Who is this qualification for?

The [Level 5 Diploma in Housing](#) is for aspiring professionals, supervisors and managers who wish to achieve [CIH Chartered membership \(CIHCM\)](#).

This qualification explores areas of ethical practice, leadership and management, strategic business planning, housing in context, managing relationships and developing professional practice skills for housing.

Why study this qualification?

The CIH Level 5 Diploma in Housing provides individuals with knowledge and understanding across key areas of housing policy and practice, at a recognised professional standard. Providing you with the knowledge and skills required to perform in a senior management role.

On completion of this qualification you will be eligible for Chartered Membership status. You must complete all mandatory units, as well as the professional practice skills in housing unit to be eligible for CIH Chartered membership.

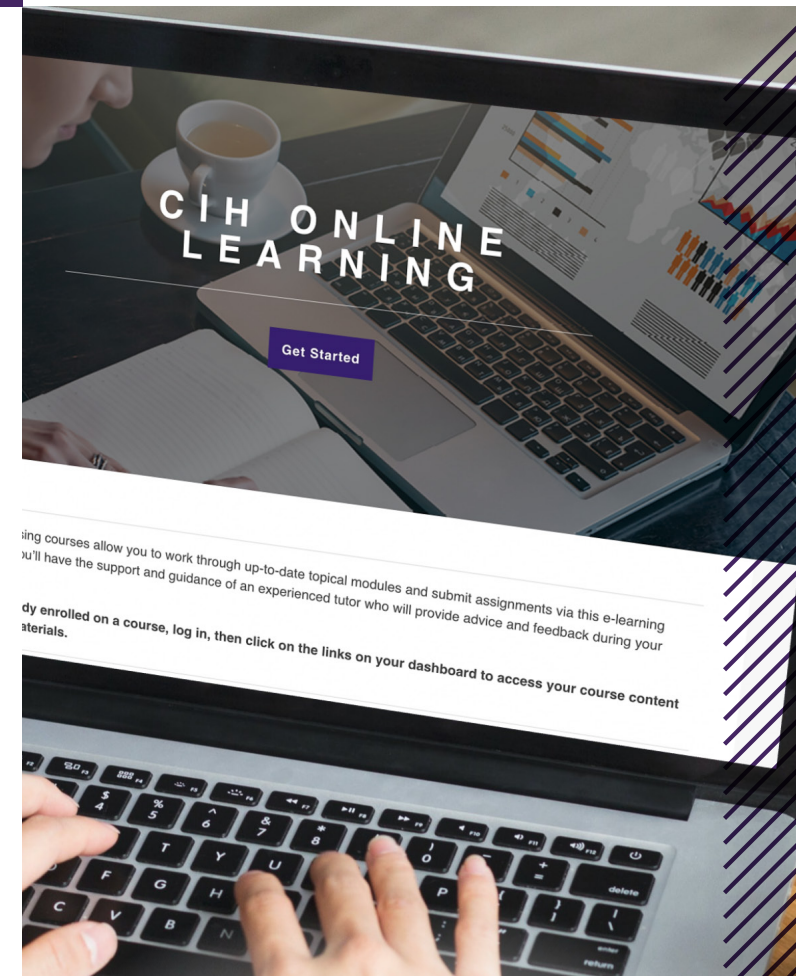
Who should apply for this qualification?

To register for this qualification you should be working in either a paid or voluntary capacity in housing and also have completed one of the following:

- ❑ CIH Level 4 Certificate for the Housing Profession OR
- ❑ CIH Level 4 Certificate, or Diploma in Housing Practice, or equivalent.

You will be asked to provide evidence of your qualifications and/or your experience of working in the housing sector as part of the application process, and may be eligible to claim Recognised Prior Learning (RPL) for the professional practice skills in housing unit.

Applicants must be aged 18 or over, be confident using IT and have access to a computer.



Duration: approximately 12 months, with an average of eight hours study a week.



Cost: depending on how you want to study the course cost can vary:

Online: £2,880

Online plus: £3,275



Includes Chartered membership for up to one year following your qualification, plus complimentary CIH membership for the duration of your studies.

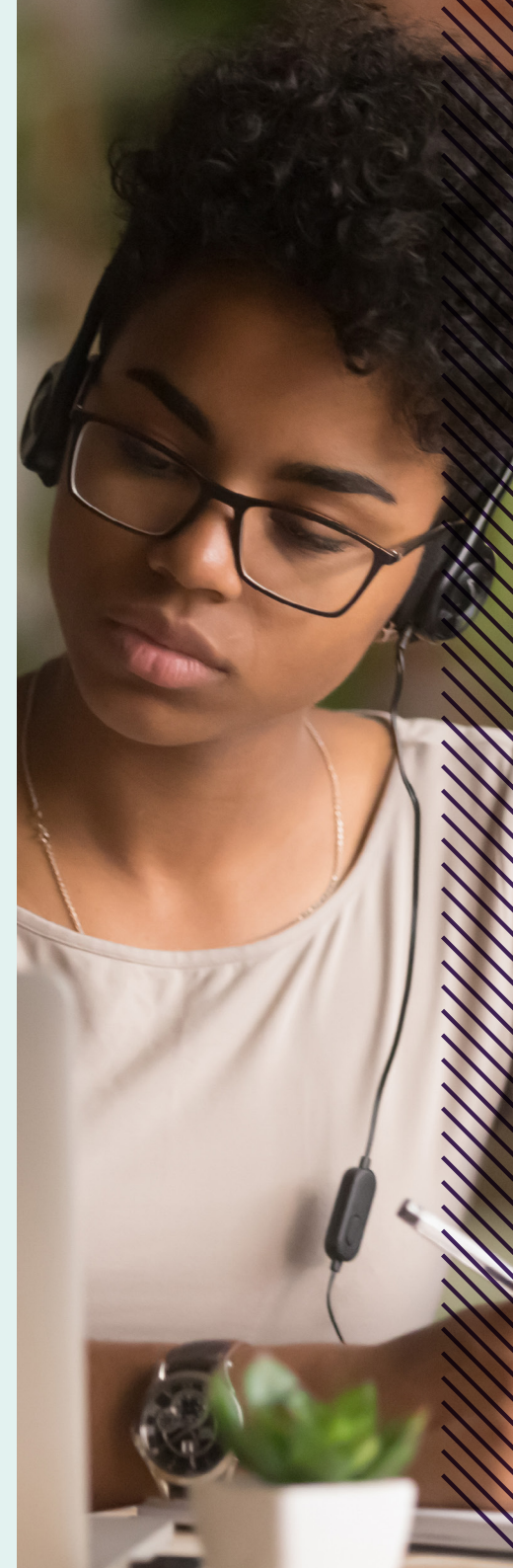
- ❑ Understand the relationship between management and leadership

- ❑ Understand the political and economic context of housing with particular regard to one aspect of housing policy
- ❑ Understand the law in relation to one aspect of housing policy
- ❑ Be able to make a case for future trends in one aspect of housing policy

Managing relationships in housing

- ❑ Understand how the changing profile of housing customers impacts on the delivery of housing services
- ❑ Understand how to communicate with housing customers
- ❑ Understand the variety of partners involved in the delivery of housing services
- ❑ Understand the principles of contract management in the delivery of a housing service



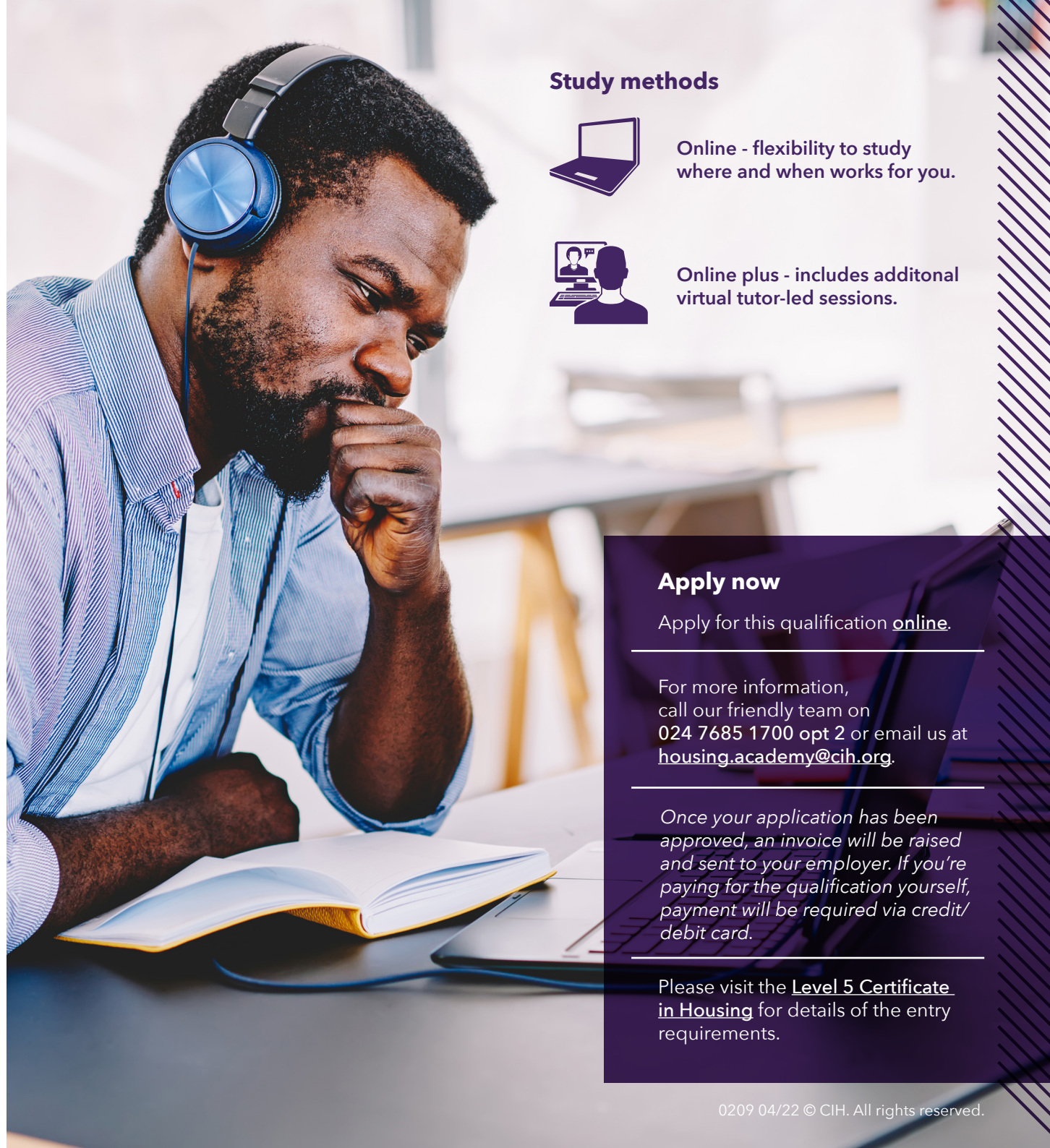
What can I expect as a CIH online learner?

CIH supports you as an [online learner](#) in a range of ways. We offer online qualifications which means your studies are done virtually, so you can fit this around your day job, personal life and make it work for you.

At the beginning of the qualification, you'll be provided with a brief introduction to the qualification and information on how it is delivered, structured and assessed.
